Pike and Total Solar Eclipses through U.S. History by Allan Vainley

In my lifetime I have only seen 3 total solar eclipses where the moon's Umbria shadow completely blocks the sun.

Zebulon Montgomery Pike may have witnessed only one such event on October 27, 1780, but it is unlikely since he was only 1 year 10 months old. [He was born on January 5, 1779 so he missed the June 24, 1778 event.]



The summer of 2017 brought the very first **total** solar eclipse exclusive to the U.S. since before the nation's founding in 1776. [AUGUST 21, 2017]

These events are extremely rare as seen in the US. Eight total solar eclipses that have hit American soil since the signing of the Declaration of Independence. They have occurred on June 24, 1778, October 27, 1780, July 18, 1860, August 7, 1869, July 29, 1878, March 7, 1970, February 26, 1979, and August 21, 2017.

I can remember bringing my students to the south lawn of Downers Grove South High School with pin-hole boxes on March 7, 1970 and February 26,

1979 to view these Total Solar eclipses.

Some trivia...

June 24, 1778. The total solar eclipse of June 24, 1778, began in the middle of the Pacific Ocean and swept eastward, passing close to Philadelphia. There, it was observed by prominent astronomer David Rittenhouse,

Thomas Jefferson, who was in Virginia at the time of the eclipse, wrote in a letter to Rittenhouse that "[we] were much disappointed in Virginia generally on the day of the great eclipse, which proved to be cloudy. In [Williamsburg], where it was total, I understand only the beginning was seen." Jefferson went on to humbly request that Rittenhouse send him a more accurate timepiece—one designed to be "for astronomical purposes only."

February 26, 1979. ... The last total solar eclipse—where the Sun is completely blocked by the Moon occurred over the United States on February 26, 1979. However, an annular eclipse—where the Moon only blocks the center of the Sun, resulting in a bright ring-occurred on May 10, 1994, and went directly over Illinois.

I am particularly attracted to an article in the current issue of <u>Sky and Telescope</u> magazine published one year before the next **total solar eclipse.**

So much of Pike's journeys will come close to the center line of this eclipse. In fact the point of greatest eclipse at 12:17: 20 pm CST is just northwest of Torreón, Mexico where Pike was on Monday May 11th, 1807.

He is buried below the center line in Sackets Harbor, NY.


During the month of May 1807, after leaving Chihuahua, Zebulon Montgomery Pike and his men were being escorted by the Spanish through New Spain/ Mexico toward the frontiers of Old Mexico from Jiménez to Mapimi on what is called today- the El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro. From May 1st to May 11, they traveled through arid country west of the Bolson de Mapimi, and then east

toward Torreón, Parras and Saltillo on what we call The Monterrey Road to avoid Old Mexico.

And Northeast toward Monclova and the Texas border from the 21st to June 1 on what we chose to call The San Antonio Road.

If he were to travel on his life path today he would cross the solar eclipse center line 4 times and ride it between LaColle Creek, QB, Canada [S of Montreal] and Sackets Harbor, NY. They would:

- throw 6 fandangos in Torreón and Monoclovo, in Coahuila, Mexico; Eagle Pass, San Antonio, Austin and Waco in Texas.
- serve him Kentucky bourbon at his father's Fort Maddox near Paducah, KY, Carbondale, IL [becoming a Saluki, as I am], St. Louis, Evansville, IN, and Cincinnati, OH.
- treat him to a Steeler's game in Pittsburgh, PA using Bradshaw's and Harris' press box.
- He would visit Niagara Falls, Canada/NY; Rochester, NY as well as the 3 plaques lauding his victory over the British in York-Toronto, Canada in 1813.
- He would visit the Cantonment his men built on Cumberland Bay Lake Champlain in Plattsburgh, NY to access British strength during the War of 1812.



Comparison 2017 to 2024- The Solar eclipse of April 8, 2024, compared with 2017, will be wider- 197.5 km across versus 114.7 km- 1.72% wider. The moon will be closer to Earth in 2024.

The duration will be nearly twice as long- up to 4 minutes 28 seconds versus 2 minutes 40 seconds. The total eclipse path will touch 15 states, 3 Mexican provinces and six Canadian provinces.

The Path of 2024. Eclipse- The umbra reaches the point of *greatness eclipse* [the instant when the moon's shadow passes closest to the center of the earth] at 12:17 CST about 150 km north east of the city of Durango. At that moment the Sun's altitude is 70°, the duration of totality is 4 minutes 28 seconds, and the path of totality is 197.5 km wide. So Pike's path on 5/11/1807 was directly below the 2024 *point of greatness eclipse* on.

When the path reaches the Rio Grande and Texas, at 1:30 CDT the totality lasts 4 minutes 24 seconds [4m 24s]. The eclipse track crosses Texas diagonally from southwest to northeast. Among the larger cities in the path or San Antonio [on the southern limit], Austin [1m 43s], Waco [4m 12s], Dallas [3m 51s], Fort Worth [2m 32s], and Texarkana [2m 22s]. Houston, the largest city in Texas, is located 200 km outside the path and experiences a partial eclipse in which the moon covers 94.3% of the sun's diameter.

Pike crossed the Sabine River and on into the US and Louisiana on July 1, 1807. He likely remained in Natchitoches, LA for some recreating his confiscated notes and creating maps of his journey. He likely crossed Louisiana to Natchez on the Mississippi. He then returned north on the Mississippi returning to Fort BelleFontaine and his sweetheart and daughter.

Approximately half of Arkansas is within the path as we move toward the Mississippi River and the mouth of the Ohio River.

The southeastern corner of Missouri, including Poplar Bluff, falls within the totality track, which receives 4m 8s of totality as well as Cape Girardeau, MO and Carbondale, IL. Totality touches Tennessee and moves into Kentucky at the mouth of the Ohio River. This area on the Ohio near the Land Between the Lakes and Paducah, KY [1m 35s] was familiar to Pike since he joined his father's Army [age 17] here, piloted supply boats down the Ohio from Pittsburg at/to his father's Fort Maddox [Paducah], and was later stationed at Cantonments Kaskaskia and BelleFontaine on the Mississippi/Missouri, as well as returning from Louisiana up the Mississippi from his SW Expedition in 1807.

Cape Girardeau, MO is Mississippi's largest city in the path and will be in the moon's umbral shadow for 4m 6s.

The central line crosses the Missouri/Illinois border near Cairo, IL at approximately 2 PM CDS. The path width is 186 km, the central duration is 4m 10s, and the Sun's altitude is 57°.

The world's Saluki capital- Carbondale, IL gets its 2nd total eclipse in less than seven years, being a major designation for the August 2017 eclipse thanks to its position near a point of greatest eclipse. This time it experiences 4m 8s of totality.

The southern half of Indiana including Pike's path on the Ohio River from Cincinnati, OH [99.4% totality] stands in or near the umbra's path. Memphis, TN will view 97% totality, St. Louis, MO and Fort BelleFontaine 98.7% and Louisville, KY 98.9%. Detroit, on the northern edge, will view a 99.1% partial eclipse.


Buffalo, NY is on the centerline bringing 3m 45s of totality. The path here is 179 km wide, and the Sun's altitude is 46°. About 32 km north of Buffalo is the world renowned Niagara Falls, where totality will last 3m 31s.

Toronto, Canada, Ontario's capital city, lies 9 km outside the path, missing totality with a 99.7% partial eclipse at 3:20 EDT. Rochester, NY stands at the southern shore of Lake Ontario, where eclipse watchers will experience 3m 39s of totality. Montreal, Canada, Quebec province's largest city will see totality for 3m 24s.

General Zebulon Montgomery Pike and several of his men suffered a hero's death in Toronto, Ontario, Canada [then York] on April 27, 1813 after capturing York [War of 1812.] Pike is buried under the center line of the 2024 eclipse.
