The Pike National Historic Trail Association Annual Meeting will be held at the Longhorn Lodge at the Royal Gorge in Canon City on Saturday May 18, 2019 from 9am - noon. All are welcome and you will help us plan our activities for the year.

We will certainly celebrate the passage of the federal legislation and at that time we will know more of how we can be of help move the Pike National Historic Trail closer to designation.

### THE PIKE NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL STUDY BILL

### HAS PASSED BOTH BODIES OF THE CONGRESS!

#### REASON TO CELEBRATE

Matthew Daly, Associated Press, reported on February 27, 2019, "another study of adding the route of explorer Zebulon Pike (for whom Pikes Peak is named) to the national scenic trails system." Actually the study is for the <u>Historic</u> Trail System and not Scenic.

Senator Cory Gardner's office indicated that "This legislation was included in the <u>S. 47, Natural</u>

<u>Resources Management Act</u>. This legislation has passed both chambers and we expect it to be signed into law by the President any day now."

To quote Senate Bill 47- Subtitle F- National Trails and Related Matters Sec. 2504 Pike National Historic Trail study

#### SEC. 2504. PIKE NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL STUDY.

Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding at the end the following:

"(46) PIKE NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL.—The Pike National Historic Trail, a series of routes extending approximately 3,664 miles, which follows the route taken by Lt. Zebulon Montgomery Pike during the 1806–1807 Pike expedition that began in Fort Bellefontaine, Missouri, extended through portions of the States of Kansas, Nebraska, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas, and ended in Natchitoches, Louisiana.".

Both Colorado Senators sponsored this legislation and The Denver Post and Pueblo Chieftain reported large **bipartisan** support.

Reason to Celebrate at our Annual Meeting on Saturday May 18, 2019

After many years of concern about the passage of federal legislation to authorize a feasibility study for the Pike National Historic Trail, we finally have reason to celebrate. The bill has passed Congress and we trust the President will sign the legislation.

The National Park Service will be authorized to Study the Feasibility of adding the Pike National Historic Trail to the National Historic Trail system. We are told that this process will take about three years. We are offering our help, data, and knowledge hopefully to speed the process. As the Park Service advises that the Pike National Historic Trail be designated in the next three years, a designation bill will be introduced. We trust that bipartisan support will continue to prevail.

"REPUBLICAN PAWNEE COUNCIL" - THIS 16" X 42" PAINTING IS COMPLETE AND MAY BE ORDERED IMMEDIATELY.



On Thursday 9/25/1806, the Pawnee Chief Caracterish (White Wolf), his two sons and warriors met them ceremonially as Pike's party approached the Pawnee village on the Republican River. Pike and his 22 men had traveled from the Osage villages [in SW Missouri] with Osage guides, Kans and one Pawnee named Frank. They were aware of the ceremonial charge which Pike describes

When we arrived within 3 miles of the village we were requested to remain, as the ceremony of receiving the Osage into the towns was to be performed here. There was a small circular spot, clear of grass, before which the Osage sat down. We were a small distance in advance of the Indians. The Pawnees then advanced to within a mile of us, and halted, divided into two troops, and came on each flank at a full charge, making all the

**gestures and preforming the maneuvers of a real war charge.** They then encircled us around, and the chief advanced in the centre and gave us his hand: his name was *Caracterich [White Wolf]*. He was accompanied by his two sons and a chief by the name of *Iskatappe [Rich Man]*. The Osage were still seated; but the Belle Oiseau then rose and came forward with the pipe, and presented it to the chief, to go whiff or two from it.

Pike's visit to the Republican Pawnee was in response to his mission to create peace on the Great Plains and to establish American sovereignty.

About two months previous, Spanish Lieut. Don Facundo Malgares and 400 men had visited the village, deposited the Spanish flag on their attempt to intercept both Lewis and Clark as well as Pike.

September 29- After a silence of some, an old man rose, went to the door, it took down the Spanish flag, and brought it and laid it at my feet, and then received the American flag and elevated it on the staff, which had lately borne the standard of his Catholic majesty. This gave great satisfaction to the Osage and Kans, both of whom, decidedly avow themselves to be under the American protection.
