We are offering for auction this Tavern sign

which may have been found in Allamatunck where Pike was born on January 5, 1779. Allamatunck is the Indian name for the still small village of Lambertton, now called Lamington, in Somerset County, New Jersey.

After Pike died on April 27, 1813 near York (Toronto), Canada, he was considered a war hero and many items with his likeness were produced including porcelain pitchers (made in England). Taverns throughout to east opened or changed their name to honor our fallen hero.

President Jefferson recognized Pike as a true American hero.
